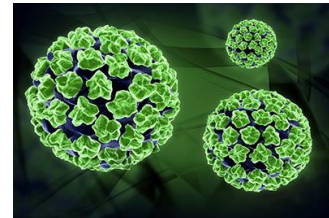

E3 Ligase EDD1/UBR5 is Utilized by the HPV E6 Oncogene to Destabilize Tumor Suppressor TIP60. (*Oncogene*, Aug 2015)

A study by Dr Sudhakar Jha's group discovered that one of the agents of cervical cancer – HPV E6 - takes advantage of the function of EDD1 to destabilise TIP60. The presence of TIP60 in cervical cancer cells reduces tumor formation. Thus, reactivation of TIP60 could be of therapeutic value for cervical cancer.
